

# CHARACTERS

(in order of appearance)

**Josephus**—The historian. A scholarly type who has great enthusiasm for his work. This character can be a man, a boy, or a girl dressed like a boy. (*speaking and singing*)

**Page**—The “definition kid.” The page has a fast hand on the dictionary and a loud voice. This character can be a boy or a girl. (*speaking and optional singing*)

**Choir Director**—An energetic person who loves to sing! This character should be a girl, especially if your choir is all female. (*speaking and singing*)

**General**—A tough and disciplined military type. This character should be a boy. (*speaking and singing*)

**Chief Priest**—A pious “know-it-all.” This character may be a girl or a boy. (*speaking and optional singing*)

**Scribe**—A master of elocution. This character can be a girl or a boy. (*speaking only*)

**Jehoshaphat**—A wise and loving king. This character should be portrayed by a boy or a man. (*speaking and singing*)

**Messenger**—An animated runner. This character should be a boy, especially if your army is all male. (*speaking only*)

**Jahaziel**—The encouraging prophet. This character can be a boy or a girl dressed like a boy. (*singing only*)

## Special groups

The **Choir**—the “sissy singers.” These should be girls.

The **Priests**—the “too-heavenly-minded-for-any-earthly-gooders.” These can be girls and boys.

The **Army**—the rough and-and-ready soldiers. These should be boys.

The **Judans**—(*optional*) The “husbands, wives, and children” of Judah. (We used teenagers for the parents and children ages four through nine for their children.)
